Full ride	<p>When searching for full ride scholarships, look at foundations and corporations, they typically award these types of scholarships. ✓ Pay for your entire college tuition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Part of a community with other students who received the scholarships ✓ Mentor programs ✓ Alumni associations that provide networking opportunities ✓ Highly competitive, but worth your time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Ford Family” + Scholarships • “Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation” + Scholarships • “Coca Cola” + Scholarships
Institutional Scholarships <i>(Four year, public/private, community colleges)</i>	<p>The universities/colleges you applied to all have university/institutional scholarships they award. Look at your school's scholarship options that they offer!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Range from \$3,000-\$15,000 ✓ Typically renewable throughout your time in college *if you maintain eligibility ✓ Can offer additional resources and support during your time in college ✓ Can sometimes be automatically awarded to you, best to apply by the priority deadline. 	<p>Search your college/university's scholarship portal with different keywords-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Diversity” + Scholarships • “Presidential” + Scholarships • “IB” + Scholarships • “General University” + Scholarships
Local Scholarships	<p>Your town typically has smaller scholarships that are open only to students who live in your region, connect with your counselor & school career center to get a list of these scholarships.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Could be refunded to your personal checking account *if you don't have any outstanding cost to your student account ✓ Smaller scholarship amounts that range around \$350-\$1,000 but they add up! ✓ Typically less competitive 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Rotary Club” + Scholarships • “Les Schwab” + Scholarships • *Your Local Bank* + Scholarships
State Scholarships	<p>Oregon Goes to College lists a number of state scholarships, you can find more information at oregongoestocollege.org/pay/scholarships</p> <p>The OSAC Scholarship Application provides current and future Oregon students one easy application to apply for multiple scholarships at one time. OSAC awards more than \$10 million in scholarships annually through more than 600 scholarships. Find more information at oregonstudentaid.gov</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Typically hosted by a state program ✓ Amount varies, they can be renewable or a one-time award ✓ You have to be a resident of the state in order to be eligible 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Latino/Latina/Latinx, Black/ African American/African Diaspora, BIPOC, LGBTQ+, Rural, Native American/ Indigenous, First Generation, Medical conditions (i.e., diabetes, celiac, heart condition, etc.), Forestry, Engineering, Art
